

Pupil Premium Funding

The **pupil premium** is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of children whose families are on low income, are children of Service men or women or are Looked After Children. The aim of Pupil Premium Funding is to close the achievement gap between these children and their peers.

The Pupil Premium Funding allocation for 2016/17 is: £45,180

The school spends the money to enhance the educational provision for those pupils that are entitled to it.

For 2016/2017 the planned expenditure is as follows:

- Classroom based support for the Premium Funded pupils during English, Maths and topic based activities. This ensures classroom based groups are smaller. The pupils work with both the teacher and LSA.
- Intervention programmes - intensive reading support programmes, writing support for a range of specific needs in different year groups, phonics support and maths intervention.
- Pastoral support for the pupils – Nurture groups in all year groups and ELSA.
- Providing additional teaching assistants to allow for smaller teaching groups.
- To help fund the additional interventions, where needed, to help support specific learning needs.
- To subsidise school trips, when appropriate.
- To support pupils who require additional pastoral support, with free holiday club and other club attendance, when necessary.
- Targeted special needs support - from LSAs (led by the Inclusion Manager) for individual and group support.

How we spend the Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium funding has the potential to have a great impact on the attainment and future life chances. In 2012/13 £26,266 was allocated as pupil premium, in 2013/14 this increased to £41,120, in 2014/15 it increased to £57,482, in 2015/16 it went up to £60,066 and this year has gone down to £45,180 due less children being eligible. We need to spend this money as effectively as possible to meet the needs of individual pupils.

Expected Impact of Funding

- School would expect Pupil Premium Funded Children to achieve at the same level as their non-pupil premium funded peers and, at least, in line with National Average.
- School would expect behaviour of Pupil Premium Funded Children to be in line with school expectations for all children.
- School would expect that the confidence, self-esteem and social skills of Pupil Premium Funded children to be in line with that of their non-pupil premium funded peers.
- Pupil Premium Funded children will have had the same opportunities to access school clubs, clubs within the community and breakfast and after school care as none Pupil Premium Funded children.

Measuring Impact of Pupil Premium Funding

- The academic progress of Pupil Premium Funded children is looked at as a specific group at the four points in the year when assessment data is collected.
- All Pupil Premium Funded children have their own tracker which are updated by Class Teachers and LSAs with any additional interventions they have received, alongside entry and exit data to a year group. This information helps build a picture of what has been successful in supporting Pupil Premium Funded children.
- Behaviour of Pupil Premium Funded children is tracked in the same way as all children in school using our class Golden Time logs. Each half term our ELSA will look specifically at the behaviour logs of Pupil Premium Funded children to ensure the data is in line with the rest of their cohort.
- Additional impact of pastoral interventions can be measured using entry and exit data from the Boxall Profile.
